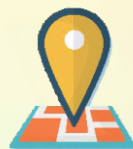

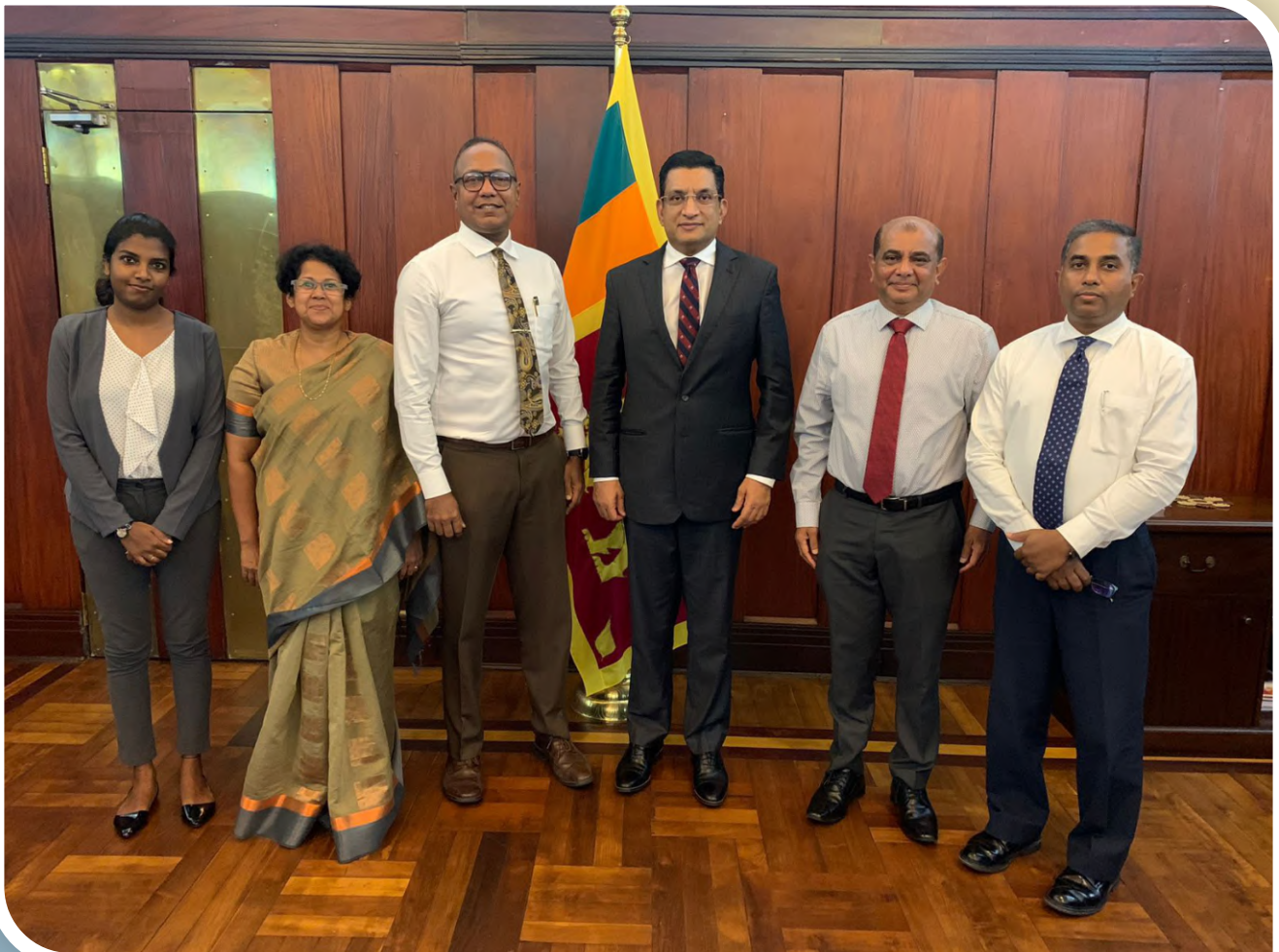

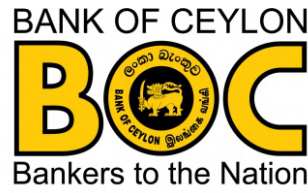

The NCE is a designated Chamber by State authorities to issue Certificates of Origin (CO) and related documents to Sri Lankan Exporters. COs issued to both member and non-member exporters and all Members are entitled to concessionary rates that can be obtained manually or digitally.

The Annual NCE Export Awards, the flagship event of the Chamber serves to recognize and reward export performance of Sri Lankan Exporters of Goods and Services, and Service Providers to Exporters. It is open for both member and non-member exporters in Sri Lanka. It is the most prestigious event in the Sri Lankan business calendar.

Trade inquiries and trade leads received from Sri Lankan missions overseas, foreign trade Chambers, and other trade organizations are disseminated to members on a timely basis. Specific trade inquiries are provided exclusively to members in the relevant sectors.

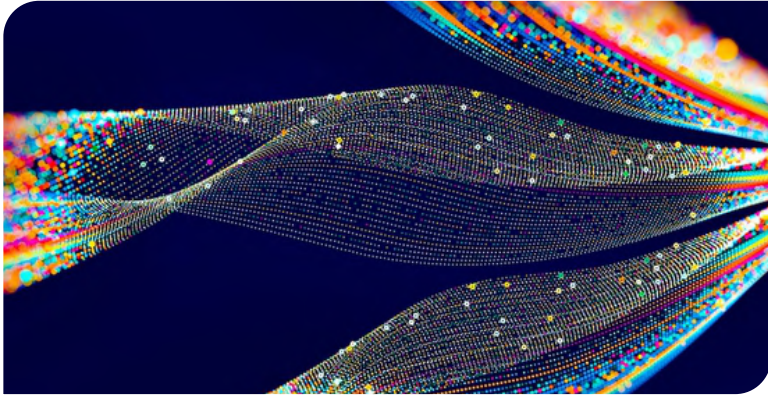
