
Participation in Workshop on WTO-TFA Articles 7.8 Expedited Shipment & E-Commerce



A Workshop on WTO-TFA Articles 7.8 Expedited Shipment and E-Commerce was held on February 16th, 2024, at the Galle Face Hotel in Colombo, that was organized jointly by the Sri Lanka National Trade Facilitation Committee (NTFC), NTFC Secretariat, and the World aiming to provide essential technical assistance to both government agencies and the private sector in effectively implementing WTO-TFA Article 7.8, focusing on expedited shipments and discussions around E-Commerce.

Two NCE Officials participated in this workshop and were engaged in thoughtful discussions and received expert guidance, gaining valuable insights into addressing existing gaps and challenges in facilitating smooth trade operations. The workshop provided a platform for fruitful exchanges of ideas, experiences, and best practices, ultimately contributing to enhancing Sri Lanka's trade facilitation mechanisms.





ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES OF ORIGIN AND RELATED EXPORT DOCUMENTS

The NCE is a designated Chamber by State authorities to issue Certificates of Origin (CO) and related documents to Sri Lankan Exporters. COs issued to both member and non-member exporters and all Members are entitled to concessionary rates that can be obtained manually or digitally.

The Annual NCE Export Awards, the flagship event of the Chamber serves to recognize and reward export performance of Sri Lankan Exporters of Goods and Services, and Service Providers to Exporters. Sri Lanka's tea production was up 1.4 percent to 18.73 million kilograms in January 2024, with high grows falling and low and mid grows rising, industry data shows.

High grown tea in January 2024 was 3.56 million kilograms, down from 3.36 million, medium grows were 2.6, up from 2.5 million kilograms and low grows were 12.56 million, up from 12.32 million kilograms last year.

Exports, including re-exports were up 6.88 percent to 18.76 million kilograms, industry data published by Ceylon Tea Brokers show.

Export earnings were reported at 102 million US dollars, up from 99.5 million dollars last year. The average FOB price was 5.45 US dollars a kilo down from 5.67 dollars last year.

Tea in bulk was 8.5 million kilograms valued at 12.79 billion rupees, tea in packets was 7.8 million kilograms valued at 13.1 billion rupees and tea in bags was 1.8 million kilos, valued at 5.06 billion rupees.

The top buyer was Iraq with 2.5 million kilos, up from 2.1 million last year followed by the UAE with 1.99 kilos, up from 1.86 million last year.

Russia bought 1.98 million kilos, down from 2.0 last year, Turkey bought 1.72 million kilos, from 2.3 million last year, while Iran bought 1.32 million, up from 614 million last year. (Colombo/Feb23/2024)
