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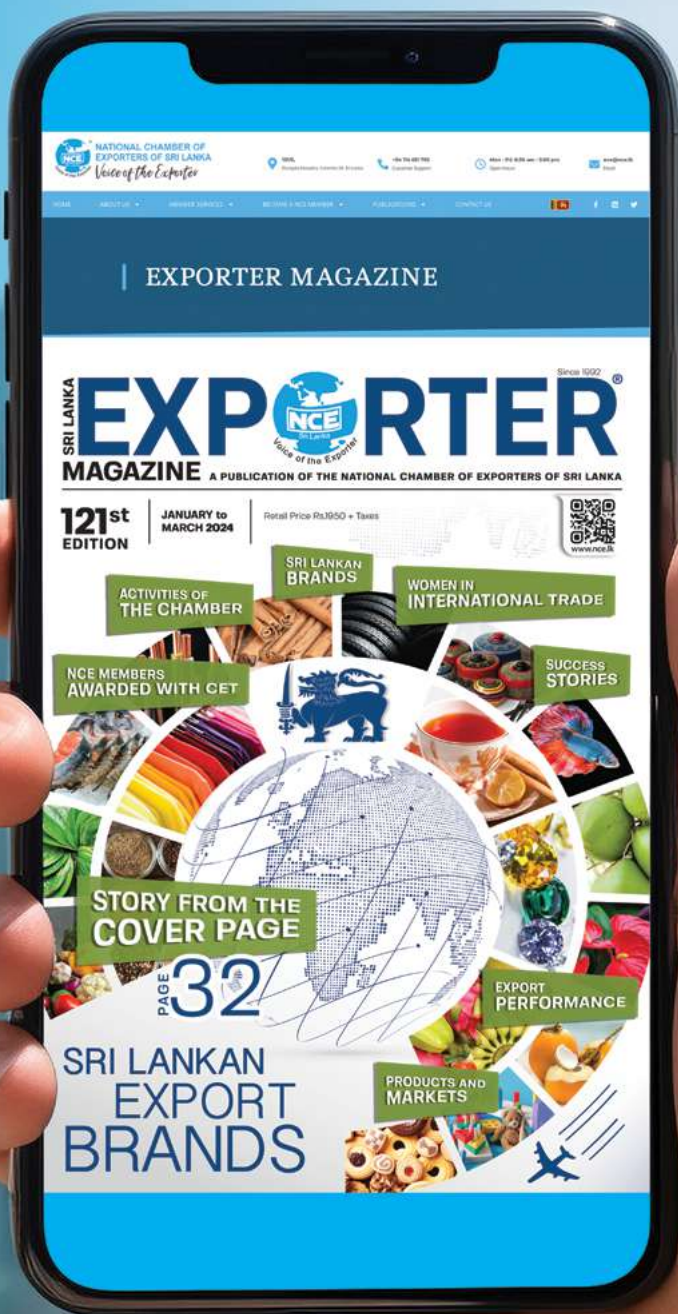

*Understanding the significance, the National Chamber of Exporters of Sri Lanka (NCE) issues a 'Certificate of Ethical Trading' to its Member Exporters who adhere to Ethical Trading Practices, Good Governance, and conformity to sound environmental and social practices based on the 08 Principles which are listed below.*

## PRINCIPLE 1

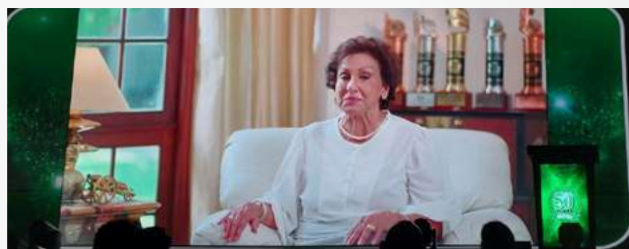




## NCE congratulates Nidro Supply (Pvt) Ltd

### Joint Chamber Press Conference

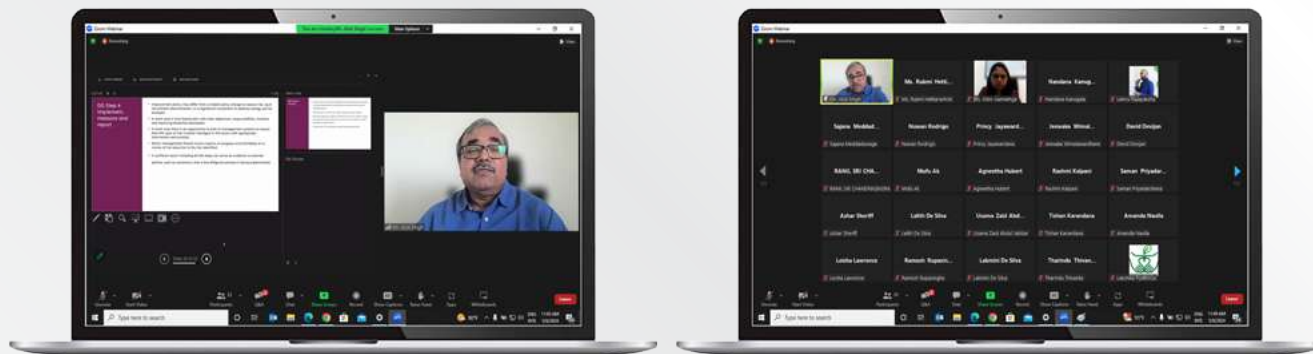

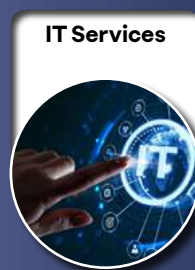

## Introduction To Trade Between Sri Lanka & Australia

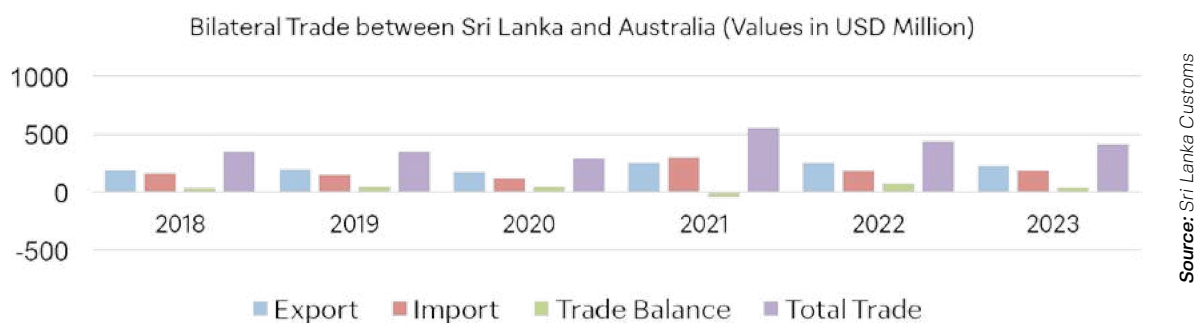
Australia is the 11th export destination for Sri Lanka. The total export value from Sri Lanka to Australia was USD 226.51 Mn in 2023 and total imports from Australia to Sri Lanka for the same period were USD 185.89 Mn. Australia is the 24th import origin for Sri Lanka.

Sri Lanka's exports to Australia has decreased by 11% in 2023 when compared to the year 2022. Imports from Australia has increased by 2.3% in 2023 when compared to the year 2022.

Sri Lanka's main export products to Australia in 2023 were Gloves, Mitts & Mittens of Textile, Women's Outerwear, Tea Packets, Pneumatic & Retreated Rubber Tyres & Tubes, Men's Outerwear, T-shirts, Men's and Women's Under Garments, Industrial & Surgical Gloves of Rubber, Motor Vehicles & Parts, Edible Preparations.

## Can you share a bit about your background and journey as a woman entrepreneur in the field of international trade?

As an alumna of the Professional Fellows Exchange Program and Australian awards, I champion initiatives that raise awareness and drive positive change. This can be due to exclusion from certain business circles or the challenge of balancing professional commitments with personal responsibilities, which is a reality many women face. At Ample, securing investment for our innovative sustainability initiatives was particularly challenging. Despite having a strong business model and clear environmental benefits, convincing investors of our vision required overcoming inherent biases and demonstrating our market potential more emphatically. Despite these challenges, I've learned that perseverance, resilience, and leveraging the support of global networks can make a significant difference.

**What advice would you offer to other women aspiring to enter or excel in the field of international trade?**

To women aspiring to enter or excel in the field of international trade, my advice draws from both my journey with Ample and the broader landscape of female entrepreneurship is to leverage your unique strengths and continuously invest in learning to stay ahead of market trends and cultural nuances. Building strategic local partnerships can significantly ease market entry, while cultural sensitivity and adaptability in business practices are crucial for success. Utilizing technology can enhance operational efficiency and responsiveness to market changes. Actively seek mentorship and networking opportunities to build a robust support system. Be prepared to advocate for your expertise and secure funding by presenting a strong business case, focusing on investors who prioritize sustainability and diversity. Above all, resilience is key, perseveres through challenges and stay committed to your vision. Drawing from my experience with Ample, these strategies have been instrumental in navigating international markets and achieving sustainable growth.

The Quality Assurance Division of Sri Lanka Standards Institution has recently obtained the Accreditation status for Pre-Export Inspection Scheme and Import Inspection Scheme from Sri Lanka Accreditation Board (SLAB) against ISO/IEC 17020:2012 Conformity Assessment - Requirements for the Operation of Various Types of Bodies Performing Inspection. Quality Assurance Division's accreditation status has boosted confidence in its ability to perform inspection activities. This recognition formally acknowledges the integrity and reliability of SLSI's Pre-export and Import Inspection Schemes. An accreditation ceremony was held at the Ramada Hotel in Colombo on 14<sup>th</sup> May 2024. The International Finance Corporation (IFC) has technically supported the Sri Lanka Standards Institution in establishing a program for internationally accredited cinnamon by assisting SLSI in setting up the necessary systems and processes to comply with international accreditation standards for Ceylon cinnamon. This accreditation assures that the Sri Lanka Standards Institution's Quality Assurance Division has the competence and impartiality to perform inspections effectively. The objective of the Pre-Export Inspection Scheme is to assure the compliance of exported products especially Cinnamon and other commodities to relevant Sri Lanka Standards or any other relevant standards specified by the importers before exporting the products to the buyer. With this certification, the exporters

can access foreign markets as well as foreign buyers can buy the products without the risk of rejection. Moreover, Import Inspection Scheme inspects 151 imported goods currently to ensure they meet Sri Lanka Standards and are safe for use. Overall, this accreditation strengthens Sri Lanka's export and import infrastructure by ensuring product quality and facilitating smoother international trade.

However, the current available regulation Exports (Standardization and Quality Control) Regulations No. 1813/15 - WEDNESDAY, JUNE 05, 2013 is in inactive or dormant, the relevant authorities could activate the existing regulations seems like a promising option to quickly enhance Sri Lankan cinnamon export quality. The established framework can be leveraged efficiently, and any updates can be addressed during activation.

By providing these services, SLSI contributes significantly to the development of Sri Lanka's manufacturing and service sectors. It helps businesses improve their product quality, become more competitive in the international market, and protect consumers from unsafe products.

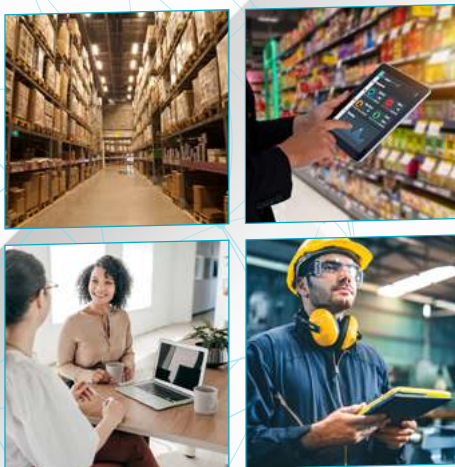

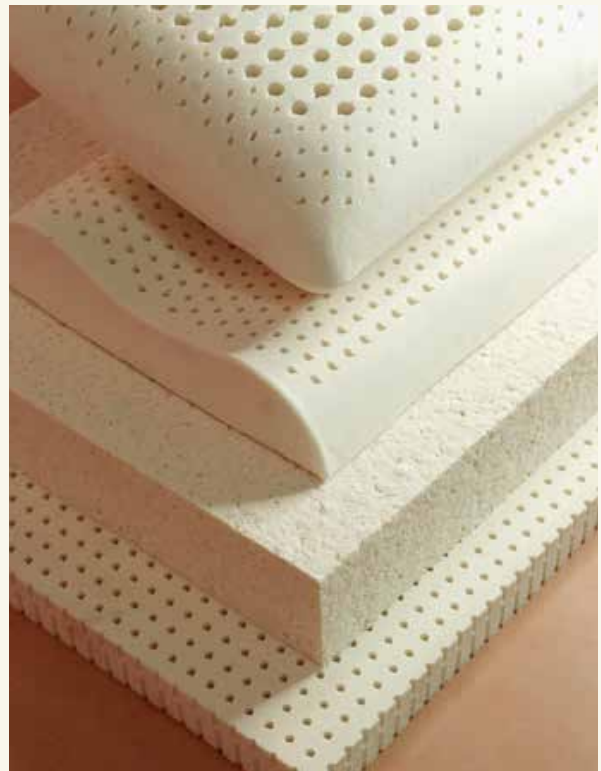

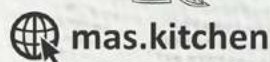

# BRAND NIDRO CELEBRATES 50 YEARS

Brand **NIDRO** was established in March 1974 as **NIDRO TRADING COMPANY (PVT) LTD.** It was a de-facto Exporter of Fruits and Vegetables, whilst also providing food and other supplies to ships calling at the Port of Colombo. This business grew. **NIDRO** became the preferred Chandler to the British and American Navies.

In 1976 **NIDRO** was presented with a unique opportunity to supply Fruit & Veg to the first Resorts in the Maldives, which was emerging as a Tourist destination. Fresh produce of Sri Lanka reached the Maldives when the French GM of the first foreign operated tourist facility in the Maldives would sail into Colombo harbour and collect the Resort's supplies in his personal yacht, a few times a month.

Later with more Resorts accessing supplies, **NIDRO** innovated a unique modality to get food to the Resorts in the Maldives by strapping the packed baskets (similar to the Tea Pluckers' basket) with selected produce, to the passenger seats the Sri Lanka Air Force flights.

Concurrently Nigel Austin spear-headed **NIDRO AGENCIES** which represented Wolff Steel Ltd from the UK, Macsteel Ltd, and later the South African Iron & Steel Industrial Corporation (ISCOR) importing construction steel into Sri Lanka.

In 1984, **NIDRO TRADING COMPANY** was re-named **NIDRO SUPPLY (PVT) LTD**, and was set up in Narahenpita which provided sufficient space for an office, pack house and storage, setting the stage for future growth as, ensuring a steady supply of produce was vital, **NIDRO** partnered with Rajah Siddambaram, a Proprietary Tea Planter and pioneered Protected Agriculture -a collaboration which is still vital 22 years on.

In 2017 **NIDRO** relocated once more – this time to its purpose built fully integrated facility in Biyagama which now accommodates its Offices and Pack House, complete with necessary Chillers & Cold Storage facilities to support the operation. A refrigerated fleet of vehicles serve as mobile collecting centres transporting focus grown produce from the provinces into the facility where it is appropriately handled packed and dispatched for Export. As is now the standard demand, the facility is **ISO22000-2018, HACCP, GMP** certified. It is also certified as an Ethical Trading Company. With the grace of GOD, **NIDRO** looks forward to the next 50 Years, which it knows will bring change and fresh challenges.

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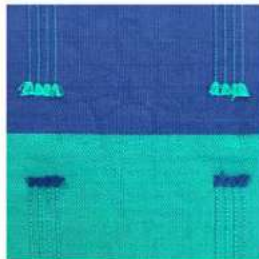




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## KANDYGS HANDLOOMS

Handloom weaving is one of the most traditional forms of creating beautiful fabrics, it is completely sustainable having a minimum impact on the environment. Yarns are interlaced together to create yards of cloth. A woman sits at a machine, dictating the design, the density and what the cloth will become. The handloom holds a special place in the textile industry, one of its unique strengths lies in its versatility, which enables it to produce complex fabrics. Another key advantage is that it does not require electricity for fabric construction. Furthermore, the handloom industry has the ability to operate very successfully as a rural industry empowering the weaver, mainly women.

Since 1971, Kandygs has been passionately following the traditional art of handloom weaving, by creating the best quality fabric, and has become a well-established company manufacturing, retailing and exporting finished textiles to the global and local market. Over the years, the landscape of the handloom industry has shifted and there are a few Sri Lankan manufacturers that still work in an ethical manner to keep the art of handloom weaving alive. Kandygs is one of the pioneers of the handloom industry in Sri Lanka and has been leading this effort.

Kandygs was started by Felix and Sita Yahampath, it was started with just 10 machines in their back garden. The Kandygs name is derived from the first initial of the names of their children. Presently, the company is operating as a family business, with the second generation joining the business in the 1990s and as of 2015, the third generation followed in their footsteps. Over the years, the company has evolved into housing over 300 handlooms, 30 power looms, 50 sewing machines and a fully equipped dye house. Our first store in Colombo, Sri Lanka opened its doors in 1976, expanding to 3 more outlets. We entered the export market in 1980, beginning in Europe with countries like Norway, Finland, Germany, the UK, Spain and then expanding to Japan, the Maldives and South Korea.

The handloom market in Sri Lanka is varied based on which company you purchase from, as it is dictated by the quality of weaving, yarn and dyeing. The Kandygs consumers are conscious of quality and design as it is a high-end specialized market. We promote the concept of slow, ethical and sustainable textiles that protect the traditional industry. When you purchase a product from Kandygs you safeguard this tradition and essentially bring tradition home. We have the added advantage of complete customisation and product development. We accommodate and encourage design innovation as long as it does not compromise our ethics. Our aim is to weave contemporary designs of the highest quality whilst safeguarding and nurturing the traditional handloom industry.

All our products are handmade in Sri Lanka. Our fabrics and products are developed and designed by Kandygs. As weavers of fabrics, our product range is wide and varied. We only use natural raw materials that are kind to nature. We weave with cotton, bamboo and jute yarn. Bamboo is an ecological alternative to the exhausted cotton industry. Our weaving with bamboo project has resulted in export innovation awards. Our products are built under the concept of slow fashion especially being home textiles, with the correct care, can last over many years.

Coloured yarns are woven by hand at our factories in Maharagama and Padukka or at our cottage weaving villages located across the island. Our pure cotton fabrics are excellent for curtaining, upholstery fabric, cushion covers, kitchenware, table cloths, serviettes, place mats, rugs, wall hangings, bags and clothes. We also have a soft line of cotton fabrics which is excellent for clothing and accessories. We weave handloom soft fabrics out of pure bamboo yarn. This is ideal for clothing, sarees, shawls, throws and toys. Our in-house sewing unit is utilised to the maximum by our design team to develop and customise products out of the fabrics we weave. We want to push ourselves and our customers towards sustainable, ethical products that our kind to people and nature.

For over 40 years we have been exporting worldwide. Primarily Europe and Asia (Japan, South Korea & The Maldives). Our European buyers have been primarily department stores and retailers that were sourcing home textiles such as readymade curtains, cushion covers and table linen. We started exporting to Norway and Finland in 1980 and have since then moved on to countries in Western Europe such as Germany, the Netherlands, UK, Spain and Italy. In the early 90s, we also entered the export market in Asia with countries such as Japan and South Korea.



We specialise in interior décor, since we are able to provide a coordinated unit of curtains, cushion covers, bed spreads, table linen and decorative wall paneling. This resulted in our expansion into the hotel and resort industry in Sri Lanka and the Maldives.
