In today's globally competitive business environment, compliance and integrity are not just legal obligations—they are strategic imperatives. The NCE remains committed to championing good governance and developing a culture of ethical trading practices across Sri Lanka's export community.





## NCE Concludes Third SVAT Seminar Session Amid High Demand



On 03rd July 2025, the NCE successfully concluded the third session of its SVAT seminar series, following overwhelming demand from the export community. With the participation of over 75 export companies, the session underscored the sector's growing concerns regarding the proposed removal of the Simplified Value Added Tax (SVAT) scheme.

This timely and informative seminar focused on clarifying key uncertainties and preparing exporters for the transition ahead.

Highlights of the session included:

- Suresh Perera, Principal – Tax & Regulatory at KPMG, who shared expert insights into the legal, regulatory, and financial implications of SVAT abolition.
- Priyanka Dissabandara, Commissioner – Risk Management Unit at the Inland Revenue Department (IRD), who delivered an in-depth presentation on the new risk-based VAT refund system and the exporter registration process.

Through initiatives like these, the NCE reaffirms its commitment to supporting exporters with relevant policy updates, expert guidance, and proactive engagement.

## NCE Explores Collaboration with Vietnam's Spice and Pepper Association



On 4th July 2025, the NCE engaged in a fruitful discussion with the Spice and Pepper Association of Vietnam to explore the potential for a strategic partnership between the two organizations.

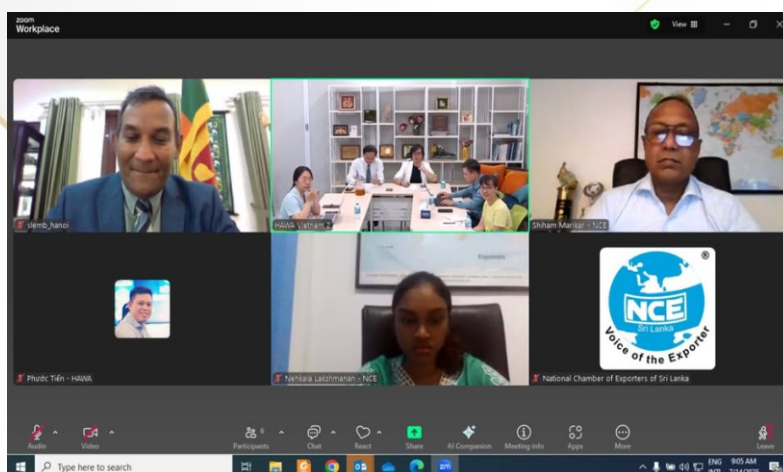
This engagement marks a positive step toward building a formal partnership that will support bilateral trade, investment, and mutual growth.

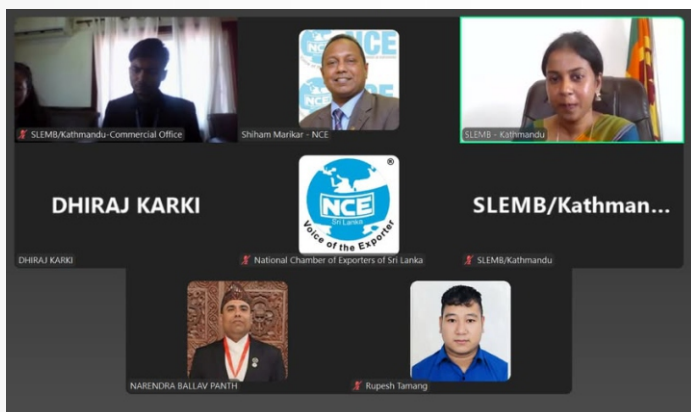
## NCE Meets with Hon. Minister of Foreign Affairs to Enhance Collaboration with Sri Lankan Missions Abroad

Print Media Partner – ANCL and several electronic media organizations were present to provide coverage, further amplifying the reach of this important annual event.

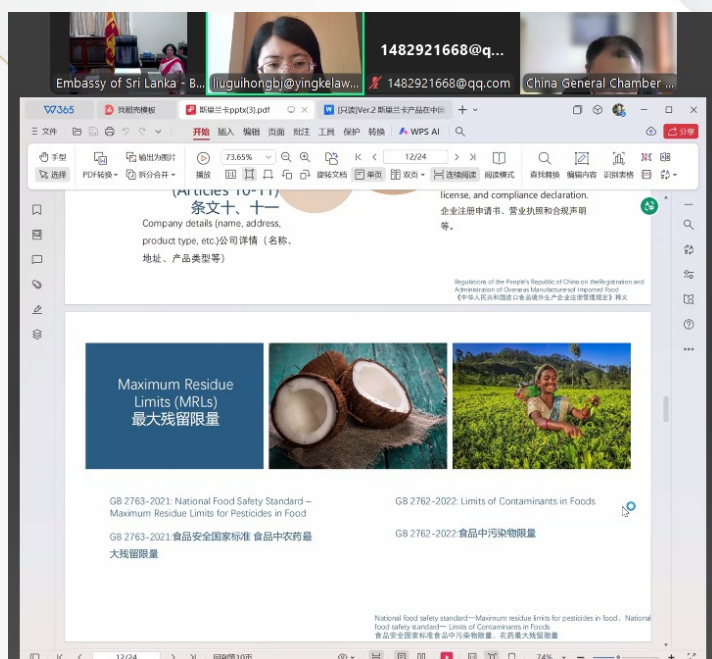
Now in its 33rd year, the NCE Export Awards continue to be the premier platform for recognizing excellence and innovation among Sri Lankan exporters across all sectors.

## B2B Delegation Visit to Jaffna Empowers Northern Export-Ready Producers



NCE successfully organized a B2B Delegation Visit to Jaffna on the 30th and 31st of July 2025, in collaboration with the Jaffna Managers Forum (JMF), Rotary Club, and the National Enterprise Development Authority (NEDA). This two-day event aimed to empower export-ready producers and strengthen the export capacity of micro, small, and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs) in the Northern Province by facilitating direct engagement between Colombo-based exporters, service providers, and local producers.

On the first day, the event took place at the Ugan Banquet Hall, J Hotels (Pvt) Ltd in Jaffna, featuring a comprehensive capacity-building program followed by structured B2B meetings. The event attracted key stakeholders, including representatives from NEDA, local government officials, and other dignitaries from the Northern Province, highlighting the importance of regional export development.

The second day was dedicated to field visits to four export-ready enterprises across Jaffna and Kilinochchi districts. The delegation had the opportunity to observe production operations and engage directly with entrepreneurs at Mango Queen Farmers Private Limited (Mango) in Meesalai, Jaffna Organic Farmers Company Limited (Banana) in Neervely, 2K Agro Products Limited (Jumbo Peanut) and MAK Agro Product Ltd (Passion Fruit) in Kilinochchi. These visits enabled the visiting exporters to explore sourcing and collaboration opportunities firsthand, developing stronger business linkages and promoting sustainable regional economic growth.

Overall, the B2B Delegation Visit to Jaffna was a significant step towards empowering Northern Province producers, expanding market access, and promoting strategic partnerships between local enterprises and established exporters. The collaboration between NCE, JMF, Rotary Club, and NEDA demonstrated a strong commitment to supporting export-ready MSMEs and enhancing Sri Lanka's export potential from the Northern region.

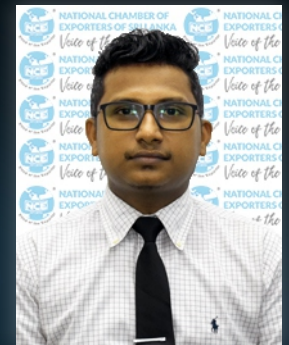
